

# Post Haste

Post Haste was foaled in April of 1971 on the Cerrillos, New Mexico, ranch of breeder Cynthia Grenfell. He was the son of Mr. Postman and a race stakes winner and halter champion daughter of Colida, MS Miss Kitty. The match proved to be a great one, as Post Haste became widely known across America as a stallion who passed on his versatility and kind temperament to his get.



By all accounts Post Haste was athletic and keen-minded from the beginning and incredibly easy to train, winning his first class in his first show after just 3 weeks of riding. Trainer Chet Bennett guided him as a 2-year-old to the National Championship in Men's Western Pleasure and Reserve Champion in a trail class of 142. Though much of his success predated the national point system, he consistently excelled in pleasure, trail, reining and cattle classes. He won many accolades including two Bronze Medallions in Performance, a Silver Medallion in Trail—Competitive Trail Riding, and was honored with his Bronze Production Plaque at Expo '91.

Post Haste sired 195 registered foals who cumulatively have earned 2,026.7 points, 56 Registers of Merit, multiple Superior Events, 2 Club Champions, 3 Versatility Champions, a Supreme Champion, 8 Superior Achievements and a very impressive 18 Bronze Medallions (2 in Trail—Competitive Trail Riding, 16 in Performance including trail, reining, cattle classes, pleasure and Camas Prairie Stump Race).

His highest total-point-earning get include: Daisy Mae Post, 894; Ima Jeanie Post, 473 and 4 Medallions; Andy Post, 293; Charlie Post, 386.5 and 1 Medallion; Doc's Post Time, 400 and 1 Medallion; Hasty Harlan, 138 and 1 Medallion; Peppy Post, 110 and 1 Medallion; Skip A Post, 32.5 and 2 Medallions; and Topper Post, 165 and 2 Medallions.

Post Haste was last owned by John Whitford of Missouri and Susan Rhea of Tennessee.
