



## ONE HOT CHIP

**ONE HOT CHIP**, "Jackson," stepped into the history books in 2014 when he became the first horse ever to win three divisions of Western Riding (Open, Youth and Non-Pro) in the same National Show. Now he joins the select group of geldings who have had such overwhelming success (14 Bronze Medallions) they've received automatic induction into the Appaloosa Horse Club Hall of Fame.

A product of the hall-of-fame breeding program of Curtis and Priscilla Barnes' Cedar Springs Farm (Galatia, Illinois), Jackson is a 1999 gelding by Hot Chocolate Chip out of Zippos Misty Lady. He was a 2-year-old futurity winner and led the nation in Junior Western Pleasure in 2004. With David Wagner he achieved a Superior Event Award in Senior Western Pleasure along with National Championships in Senior Western Pleasure, Non-Pro Western Riding and Non-Pro Western Pleasure. He then went on to win multiple championships and high points with Cindy Mergaert and youth owner Bethany White of Gainesville, Florida.

Since 2010 Jackson has been a beloved part of the Hulcher family of Argyle, Texas. Jennifer and her daughter, Brooke, enjoy showing him in Non-Pro and Youth events as well as Open and have amassed significant success with him.

Twelve of Jackson's 14 Hall of Fame-qualifying medallions were earned in Western Riding, and while he certainly excels in that discipline his record proves great versatility, with points and notable wins in everything from Showmanship to Trail.

At the time of this writing Jackson has an impressive 2,122.5 lifetime points, 8 Superior Events, 9 Registers of Merit, and 16 Year End Top Ten Awards to accompany his 14 Bronze Medallions—12 in Senior Western Riding, 1 in Senior Trail and 1 in Junior Western Pleasure. A keen, kind and highly talented horse, One Hot Chip has earned his place in the ApHC Hall of Fame.
