

Gay Bars Silver

2000 Stallion

A star performer and sire who died too young, 2000 stallion Gay Bars Silver (Gay Bars Jess [QH] x Silver Roxie), owned by Liz Kincaid of T.O.P. Appaloosas in Argyle, Texas, has been inducted into the ApHC Hall of Fame after his death in 2017, at only 17 years old.

Silver was a multiple ApHC and ApCHA cutting champion, as well as a local winner in "area 9" where most of the top cutters performed. His trainer Mike Combs referred to Silver as "scary smart," but with a gelding-type demeanor that served him well with other horses and people.

As a sire, Silver's 79 get included 16 performance point earners and six halter point earners, but the former include winners of \$11,600 in NRHA money. His foals currently have six bronze medals, but continue to excel in the show ring. Of his five-foal first crop, 2005 gelding Gunna Go N Gitem (out of Lucky Six Stars) was the highest-scoring gelding at the 2008 World Show and won the ApRHA Open Reining Futurity.

In addition to his Hall of Fame induction, Silver will be immortalized as a member of the Limited Edition Horse Stone series from H & H Winners' Circle.
