Dust'Em

ust'Em was a 1976 stallion by Dusty Way (fourth generation Patchy Jr., ApHC Hall of Fame) and out of Precious Oldie (QH). He was bred by Wright Brothers of Kennewick, Washington, and last owned by Larry E. Grenz of Zillah, Washington.

In 1978 he was Bronze Medallion Racing Stallion and over his career on the track had 12 wins, 2 places, and 1 show out of 20 starts for lifetime earnings of \$22,202.29. He had five Stakes Race wins in 1978-1979 in the Fun Sun Derby, the Washington-Bred Futurity, the National Appaloosa Futurity, the Coeur D'Alene Appaloosa Futurity, and the Waitsburg Futurity, and a second in 1981 in the Spotted Sprint Stakes.

He sired 124 foals between 1980 and 1999 — many raced and a few did well in the show ring as well. His race foals earned six Bronze Medallions and combined total earnings of \$445,285.29. His show get included three Performance Point Earners for 215.5 points, seven Registers of Merit, a Performance Superior Event, and a Versatility Champion.

His race Medallion winners were: Golden Dustem 1985 Bronze Racing Two-Year-Old Filly, Honor Dustem 1986 Bronze Racing Two-Year-Old Colt, Little Gee Gee 2001



Bronze Racing Three-Year-Old Filly, Lobo Dio 1990 Bronze Racing Two-Year-Old Colt, Nuther Dustem 1989 Bronze Racing Two-Year-Old Colt, and Victory Dust 1991 Bronze Racing Three-Year-Old Gelding. Currently 16th on the list of all-time leading sires by dollars earned, his impact on Appaloosa racing has rightfully elevated him to the Appaloosa Horse Club Racing Hall of Fame.
