

High Sign Nugget

High Sign Nugget was a talented and influential stallion bred by Wayne Collier of Wauchula, Florida. Foaled in 1988, he was purchased in 1990 by Jim Dobler of Alberta, Canada, and was loved as part of his family until his passing. He was sired by High Sign (ApHC Hall of Fame induction 1992) and out of Hen Penny, descended from Top Hat H. (ApHC Hall of Fame 1992).

In Open competition between 1991 and 2002 he earned two Bronze Medallions for World Championships in Working Cow Horse, two Reserve Championships, five Top Fives, a Top Ten, four Canadian National Championships, four Year-End Top Tens in Cutting and Working Cow Horse, and two Registers of Merit in Reining and Working Cow Horse. Jim also showed him to three Non-Pro World Championships and a Reserve in Working Cow Horse.

As a sire High Sign Nugget passed on his even temperament and agility to 228 foals between 1993 and 2015. His get comprise



75 Performance Point earners for 1,527.6 points, 21 Halter Point earners for 353.5 points, and have so far racked up 56 Registers of Merit, one Halter Superior Event Championship, one Performance Superior Event Championship, two Versatility Championships, an impressive 48 Bronze Medallions, and recorded more than \$440,000 in winnings (Equistat).

Popular as an Appaloosa at predominantly Quarter Horse venues, High Sign Nugget had a fan following and was featured in multiple publications. As a true ambassador of the breed, his elevation to the Appaloosa Horse Club Hall of Fame is well earned.
