splitter, Michigan Regional, and the Ohio Summer Classic. Out of 20 Snaffle Bit or Junior classes at these shows he captured 14 wins, five seconds and one third. This momentum set him up well going into his first National Show in 1992 where he was fifth in Men's Western with Shane Dowdy and tenth in Ladie's with Robin Gollehon. His showing culminated with a fourth out of 34 in Ladies' Western Pleasure with Robin Gollehon at the 1992 World Championship Show, Year-End Top Ten Three-Year-Old Snaffle Bit Western Pleasure, and two Registers of Merit in Western Pleasure.

His impressive record as a sire spanned 16 years from 1993 to 2009. Of his 253 foals he had 112 Performance Point Earners for 3,604.5 points, 75 Halter Point Earners with 829 points, 114 Registers of Merit, 2 Halter Superior Event winners, 6 Performance Superior Event winners, 6 Club Champions, 4 Versatility Champions, 1 Supreme Champion, 29 Bronze Medallions, and 2 Silver Medallions.

His influence on the show world earned him well-deserved induction into the Appaloosa Horse Club Hall of Fame in 2019.

Zip'N To Paradise was a 1989 Stallion (Zippo Pine Bar (QH) x Fly To Paradise) who rose to Western Pleasure notoriety in the early 1990's. He was bred by Margaret Cotter of Whitewright, Texas, and last owned by Cheryl Pozzi of Edgewood, New Mexico.

He began his career with successive wins in Two-Year-Old Snaffle Bit Western Pleasure at large regional shows like the Illini Rail-
