Foaled in 1972, Deep South embarked on a racing and sire career that would be remembered for his record setting and Lifetime Dollars-Earned as a sire. Deep South was sired by Luminary II, an English Thoroughbred registered in the United Kingdom and imported to the United States. He was out of Rose Time, Racing Hall of Fame class 1988. Ocala, Florida's 2007 Racing Hall of Famer Charles Tanner Jr. bred, owned, and raced Deep South. He had 12 starts, seven wins, and four places during his two-season career. He earned \$36,258 before being sold to a syndicate headed by Utah's David Nemelka (Racing Hall of Fame, 1991) and Ohio's Ben Mear.

During Deep South's two-year career, he accrued six racing awards, set four Track/World Records, and tied another four Track/World Records. His awards included the ApHC Champion Running Stallion, Champion Running Two-Year-Old Sprint Colt, Champion

Running Two-Year-Old (all sexes), Leading Starter Dollars Earned (all ages and sexes), a Bronze Racing Medallion, and the ApHC Champion Running Three-Year-Old Colt.

After Deep South's retirement from racing, he sired 414 registered foals. The first three of his lifetime starters went to tracks in 1978. Most of his starters raced through the 1980s, nine raced after 1991, and one was still competing in 1997. Of his 414 registered foals, 150 raced. One hundred and seventeen foals were money earners, 69 were race winners producing 230 wins, 13 horses earned Bronze Racing Medallions, 33 earned a register of merit, eight of his get have ApHC/ERC Champion Awards, and two get earned Supreme Champion titles. Deep South's starters earned a total of \$899,665. The Appaloosa Horse Club is honored to welcome Deep South into the Racing Hall of Fame—congratulations Deep South!
