Motion 01-11-2023

The 2023 ApHC Board of Directors moves to approve Motion 9-6-2023, as follows:

The 2023 ApHC Board of Directors moves to accept the addendum to Rule 500, with the additional verbiage that conversations can be had with judges in the presence of ApHC Staff, Show Management, and/or Ring Stewards.

500. General Rules for Judges

H.10. ApHC judges shall not have any social contact with exhibitors, owners, trainers or agents 48 hours prior to, during, and 48 hours after completion of judging of any ApHC event/show. This includes personal contact, phone calls, text messages, and all social media. If approached by exhibitors, owners, trainers, or agents before, during, or after an approved ApHC event/show the judge should be polite, professional, and courteous but should make every effort not to engage in social activities.

Exhibitors are permitted to ask a judge questions pertaining to their test, when also in the presence of ApHC Staff, Show Management, and/or Ring Stewards.

Attachment C:

JAC Ranch Committee – Rule Change Suggestions

- 1. Create one RANCH category for all classes within rulebook (ranch rail, ranch riding, ranch trail, ranch reining ranch conformation).
 - a. Include current general description of ranch horse (example 720 A)
 - b. Include current Ranch Class Apparel and Equipment rules (examples 720 C)
 - i. Hoof polish *not allowed*.
 - c. Move description of Ranch Horse Gaits (currently only reside in Ranch Rail, should apply to all ranch classes)
 - i. In all gaits, movement of the ranch horse should simulate a horse needing to cover long distances, softly and quietly, like that of a working ranch horse. The following terminology should apply:
 - 1. Walk the walk is a natural, flat footed, four beat gait. Thegait is rhythmic and ground-covering. As in all gaits, the horse should display a level, or slightly above level topline with a bright, attentive expression.
 - 2. Extended Walk the extended walk is an obvious lengthening of stride that will naturally increase the pace. The horse should move in a natural manner (not a running walk) as if it were moving across and open pasture.
 - 3. Trot the trot is a natural two-beat gait demonstrating more forward motion than the western jog.
 - 4. Extended Trot the extended trot is an obvious lengthening of the stride with a definite increase in pace. The horse should be moving in a manner as if it were covering large areas on a ranch with an above level topline.
 - 5. Lope the lope is a three-bait gait. The lope should be relazed and smooth with a natural, forward moving stride.
 - 6. Extended Lope the extended lope is not a run or a race but should be an obvious lengthening of the stride, demonstrating a forward, working speed. The horse should display an above level topline with a bright attentive expression.
 - d. Add allowance for one or two hands when using snaffle or hackamore to be consistent with other breeds/industry
 - i. When exhibiting in a snaffle or hackamore, an exhibitor may switch between two hands and one hand on the reins at any time.
 - e. Move repeated rules that apply to all classes to general section
 - i. Sitting at the regular trot and lope is recommended, though standing in the stirrups at the extended trop or extended lope, or posting the extended trot is acceptable.
 - ii. Touching or holding the saddle horn is acceptable.
 - f. Add two rein equipment will be permitted as outline in Rule 715-A-10.
 - g. Add Get down rope will be permitted as outlined in Rule 715-A-11.
 - h. Ensure the term "jog" is removed anywhere a ranch trot is being described.
- 2. Ranch Riding Penalties adjust to match the industry standard only listing those to be changed (updated or added)
 - a. One (1) point penalties
 - i. Over-bridled add (per maneuver)

- ii. Out of frame add (per maneuver)
- iii. Wrong lead or out of lead for 2 strides or less (add)
- b. Three (3) point penalties
 - i. Wrong lead or out of lead for more than two strides
 - ii. Trotting for more than 3 strides in lope departures or exiting a rollback into a lope from a stop or walk.
- c. Off pattern (OP)
 - i. Repeated blatant disobedience
 - ii. Use of two hands (expect junior horses shown in snaffle bit/hackamore), more than one finger between split reins or any fingers between romal reins (expect the two rein)
- d. Zero score
 - i. Remove Blatant disobedience.
- 3. Ranch Trail Penalties adjust to match industry standard only listing those to be changed (updated or added)
 - a. 724 E change to minimum 6, maximum 10 obstacles (to match scoresheet)
 - b. One (1) point penalties
 - i. Over-bridled add (per maneuver)
 - ii. Out of frame add (per maneuver)
 - iii. Wrong lead or out of lead for 2 strides or less (add)
 - iv. One to two steps on mount/dismount or ground tie except shifting to balance (add)
 - c. Three (3) point penalties
 - i. Wrong lead or out of lead for more than two strides
 - ii. Trotting for more than 3 strides in lope departures or exiting a rollback into a lope from a stop or walk (add)
 - iii. Three to four steps on mount/dismount or ground tie (add)
 - iv. Missing or evading part of a log/obstacle with one foot (add)
 - d. Five (5) point penalties
 - i. Five or more steps on mount/dismount or ground tie (add)
 - ii. Missing or evading part of a log/obstacle with more than one foot (add)
 - e. Off pattern (OP)
 - i. Incomplete maneuver
 - ii. Eliminating or adding maneuver
 - iii. Failure to follow line of travel, work obstacle from incorrect side/direction
 - iv. 3rd refusal
 - v. Repeated blatant disobedience
 - vi. Failure to dally and remain dallied
 - vii. Use of two hands (except junior shown in snaffle bit/hackamore), more than one finger between split reins or any fingers between romal reins (expect in the two rein)
 - viii. Failure to open and shut gate or failure to complete gate
 - f. Disqualified (zero points)
 - i. Lameness
 - ii. Abuse
 - iii. Leaving working area before pattern is complete
 - iv. Illegal equipment
 - v. Disrespect of misconduct
 - vi. Inapproproate western attire
 - vii. Fall of horse or rider
 - viii. Remove all other than above

- g. 724 H(a) (Add) If measured distances are used, recommend walk over be seet 30-36", trot overs 32-36", extended trot 36-42".
- 4. Ranch Reining adjust to match industry standard only listing those to be changed (updated or added)
 - a. 722 C Patterns may be chosen from any of the ranch reining patterns, working cow horse patterns or as approved by the show management and judge. The use of standard reining patterns is discouraged.
 - b. Five (5) point penalties
 - i. Move use of two hands to OP
 - ii. Move more than one finger between two reins to OP
 - c. 722 G **Remove** the second sentence (Any attempt to alter length...)
 - d. Off Pattern (OP)
 - i. Incomplete maneuver
 - ii. Eliminating or adding a maneuver
 - iii. Repeated blatant disobedience
 - iv. Use to two hands (except junior shown in snaffle bit/hackamore), more than one finger between split reins or any fingers between romal reins (except in the two rein)
- 5. Ranch Conformation
 - a. Add rule (7). Exhibitors wearing spurs not to be penalized or disqualified.
- 6. Move Box Drive Box Drive from Working Cow Horse section to Ranch rename **Ranch Cow Work.**
 - a. Change to include all ages in Open (Junior and Senior)
 - b. NP and Youth classes to remain the same.
