#### ++₁ Racing Program ++₁

The ApHC has a long-established and successful racing program. The racing department recognizes and records race results in which horses are registered with the ApHC. Races will also be recognized in which Appaloosas compete with a horse registered with AQHA, Jockey Club and APHA. Our department offers awards annually. Champion Year-End horses, Medallion earning horses and Regional High-Point Champions. Registers of Merit (ROM) can be earned anytime by obtaining a speed index of 80 or higher at recognized official distances and will be part of the horse's official racing record. The Executive Race Committee works with the department to determine a Grade for Stakes

races, updating racing rules. The department works with Equibase, the official supplier of racing information and statistics of handicapping products on Appaloosa racehorses.


