Regional Shows Department

Attention all regional show management: show results from shows held August 31st or before need to be received in office by September 5th to count towards World qualification.

Registration Department

The stallion report deadline is November 30th to avoid late fees. Reports must be postmarked, submitted online, or E-mailed on or before November 30th, or they will be assessed a late fee. Online filing is for Appaloosa stallions only.

Online registration is now available! Horses registered by this means must be parentage verified through DNA testing. Online applications cannot be rushed, and they cannot be transferred. Applications needing to be rushed or transferred will still need to be sent in by regular mail.

The lifetime member RUSH black out dates will begin September 24th and will be in effect up until the start of the World Show. A RUSH fee will apply on applications needing to be rushed during those dates.

Affiliate Spotlight

Meet one of our international affiliates—the Appaloosa Horse Club of Canada (ApHCC)!

In 1877 Chief White Bird took flight along with Nez Perce men, women and children, from the Bear Paw Mountains of Montana where in October of that year Chief Joseph had surrendered to the US cavalry. Reports from the North West Mounted Police stated that the Nez Perce survivors straggled across the border to join Chief Sitting Bull and his Sioux at Wood River, Saskatchewan. It was estimated that some 300 horses were brought with them. The NWMP transferred the Nez Perce to the Fort Wash area for ease of administration.



Horses originating from those brought to Saskatchewan by the Nez Perce were sold and traded throughout Saskatchewan and Alberta. Ranchers such as Ed McRae, John R. Poynter, and George Malmberg & Sons, to name a few, began breeding the spotted horses. Because a Canadian registry had not been founded many of the Appaloosas that were raised in Canada were registered with the ApHC which became a registry in 1938. In 1947 the Canadian Appaloosa Horse Association was formed near Lloydminster, Saskatchewan. This Association issued certificates for horses "inspected and approved as suitable in type and colour for a foundation animal of the Appaloosa Breed in Canada". The President of the Association was V.C. Foster of the Foster Ranch which was located northeast of Lloydminster, Saskatchewan.



As the number of Appaloosas grew in Canada so did the desire for a Canadian registry. The inaugural meeting of The Appaloosa Horse Club of Canada was held on April 16, 1954. The meeting was organized by Jim Wyatt and held at the family ranch just out of High River, Ab. Jim was elected as President of the newly formed club, a position that he held for 13 years. Jim was a Director with the ApHCC for 21 years and was also a Director with the ApHC from 1952 to 1961.

Jim had purchased his first Appaloosa in 1940. He and his family went on to develop one of the leading herds in Canada.

From its inauguration until 1999 the ApHCC remained a registry based on the colour and characteristics of the horses. In 1999 the ApHCC became an organization dedicated to the development of a Distinct Breed for Canadian Registered Appaloosa horse

through its registration and identification process and other programs. Distinct Breed Status is proven by parentage verification, blood typing and four generations of colour and characteristics pursuant to the requirements of the Animal Pedigree Act of Canada. This makes the ApHCC a unique Appaloosa registry.

As with many other organizations the number of members has decreased over the years so the ApHCC has altered to accommodate this. The main focus now is the registry for the breeders who wish to have their horses reach Distinct Breed Status and earn points on their horses. To accumulate points, owners are able to show their horses at open shows, rodeo events and other sanctioned events such as reining, reined cowhorse, cutting, extreme cowboy, hunter/jumper etc. and earn points at these events based on placings.

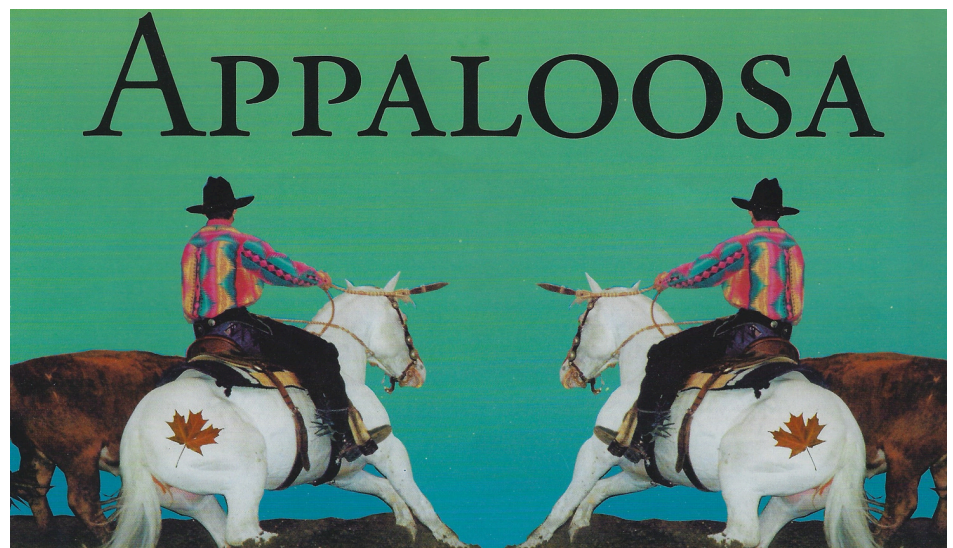
In response to the need to identify animals that do not qualify for Distinct Breed Status under the Animal Pedigree Act, the ApHCC has developed an Identification Certificate program. This is specifically for horses that have Appaloosa colouring but are

of unknown or unqualified parentage and do not qualify for Distinct Breed status. The Certificate of Identification will have a picture of the horse, a written description and an assigned number that will be recorded at the ApHCC office. These certificates will be transferable, but at NO TIME will horses with an Identification Certificate or any of their progeny be accepted into the Appaloosa Horse Club of Canada Distinct Breed Registry.



Like many other organizations the ApHCC has had to face the challenges that have been presented by changes to the economy and lifestyles. It is an organization that has endured and is moving forward to serve its members.

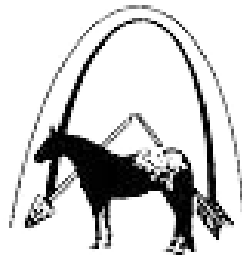


The BAAA's main goal is for everyone to feel welcome.

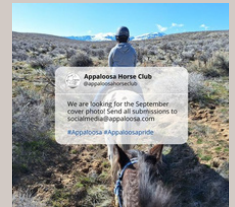
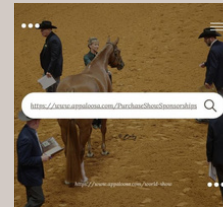
