

Spring is just around the corner... literally! Thursday, March 20th, marks the official first day of spring, and I hope warmer weather is on its way for everyone.





NSBA smart points

NSBA Smart Points makes showing even more exciting by rewarding youth riders for their participation! In 2023, Smart Points riders earned an incredible \$19.24 per point! To qualify, riders need an NSBA membership, a one-time \$25 Smart Points enrollment, and must compete on an NSBA Incentive Fund (IF) horse or enroll their horse separately. Points earned in Dual Approved, Novice youth, and walktrot classes turn into cash rewards! Earnings are paid out annually! Don't miss out! Enroll today and get rewarded for doing what you love!

Spotlight

A SPOT FOR THE FUTURE

For young equestrians chasing their dreams, A Spot for the Future is making a real difference. This scholarship program, launched in late 2023, helps Appaloosa youth exhibitors at the Youth World Championship Show by giving them a financial boost for their education. Whether they're heading to college, trade school, or another approved program, this initiative is all about setting youth up for success while keeping them involved and supporting the Appaloosa community.

Just within its first year, A Spot for the Future launched into motion—by March 2024, fundraising efforts had already secured \$13,600! This was enough to fully fund the first round of scholarships. Just a few months later,



in June, another \$16,000 was raised, ensuring scholarships for a second year. By July, sixteen youth exhibitors each received \$500 scholarships.

Scholarships are awarded through a random drawing of pre-entries in eight event categories: cattle, games, halter, hunter, ranch, showmanship, trail, and western events. This system gives every competitor a fair shot at earning some financial help while encouraging more youth to get involved in the Appaloosa community.



Past recipients are already seeing the benefits. Brooke Kuronya, who won a scholarship in the 14-18 Showmanship category in 2024, shared, "The scholarship has helped me pay for my schooling to become a veterinarian one day. It paid off almost a whole semester of classes, which was very exciting. It is helping me pursue my future career one day and I couldn't be more grateful".

Evelyn Bitner, an early recipient, added, "I was surprised! Admittedly, I didn't know a ton about the program, but I'm very grateful for it. I think they're doing really cool things to support youth and the breed as a whole".



With ongoing fundraising, A Spot for the Future hopes to expand, offering more scholarships to kids who may

not have the chance to compete at the world level. The program's dedication to supporting young riders shows that today's youth exhibitors are the future of the industry.
