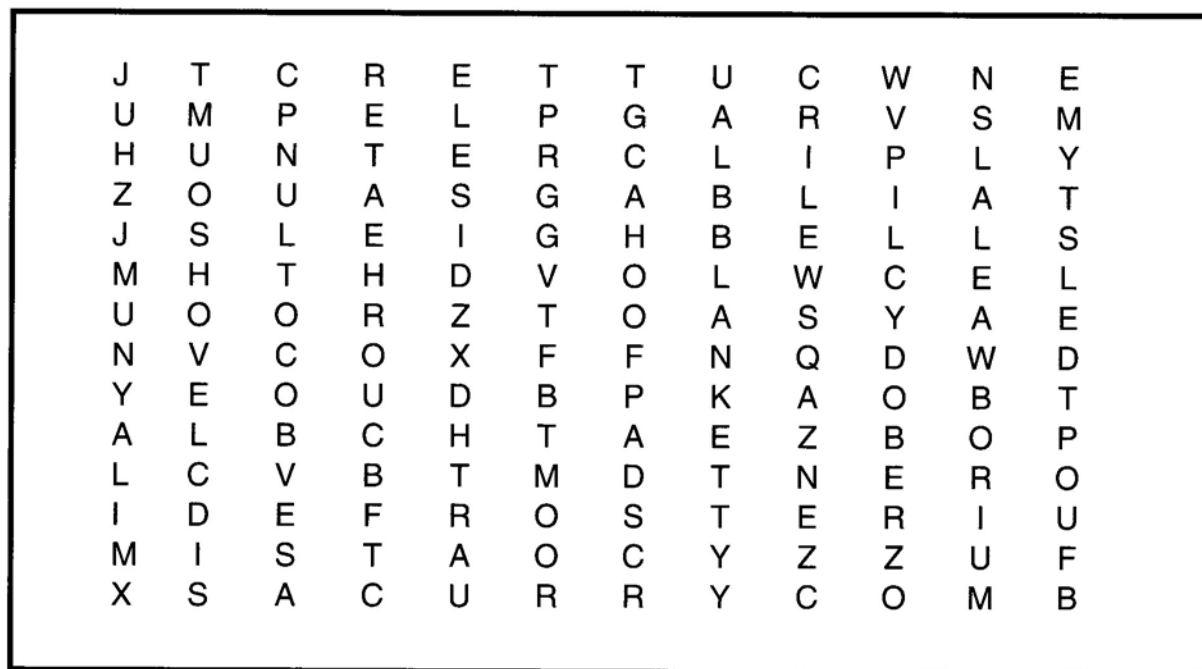


Hap P. Loosa stitched his winter blankets but is still searching for many of these winter words. Can you help him?



1. **BORIUM** – A substance your farrier can weld onto horseshoes that makes your Appaloosa less likely to slip on ice or pavement.
2. **BLANKET** – Your Appaloosa's cloth jacket. If your horse is outdoors, make sure it is waterproof!
3. **BODY CLIP** – An all-body haircut that keeps horses' coats summer-smooth for winter showing.
4. **CURRY COMB** – A grooming tool used to remove mud and loose hair from your horse's coat.
5. **DEFROSTER** – A device to keep the water in a trough from freezing.
6. **FUZZY COATS** – The kind of fur horses get in cold weather.
7. **HEATER** – Something you'll want in your barn when it's cold.
8. **HOOD** – A fabric covering for your Appaloosa's head and neck.
9. **HOOF PADS** – Sheets of leather or other material that fit between horses' hooves and their shoes to keep snow from balling up in their soles.
10. **HUNTER CLIP** – This haircut leaves a saddle patch of hair on the horse's back and on the horse's legs.
11. **SLED** – Some of these are big enough for horses to pull; you sit on smaller ones to ride down snow-covered hills.
12. **SLEIGH BELLS** – These let everyone know there's a horse-drawn vehicle coming.
13. **TAIL BAG** – This covers a horse's tail to keep hair clean and in good condition.
